

Quilt of Many Ribbons



GENERAL DIRECTIONS

- ✘ All seam allowances are 1/4"
- ✘ WOF = **W**idth **O**f **F**abric
- ✘ Every effort has been made to ensure the accuracy of this pattern.

CUTTING

FABRIC # 1 (lightest):

- ✘ Cut 18 - 2 1/2" x WOF strips (blocks)
- ✘ Cut 16 - 2" x WOF strips (borders)
- ✘ Cut 8 - 3 1/2" x WOF strips (pieced border)
Subcut into 88 - 3 1/2" squares
- ✘ Cut 1 - 2" x WOF (pieced border)
Subcut into 8 - 2" x 3 1/2" rectangles
- ✘ Cut 1 - 21 1/2" square (applique background)

FABRIC # 2 (medium):

- ✘ Cut 18 - 2 1/2" x WOF strips (blocks)
- ✘ Cut 2 - 6 1/2" x WOF strips (pieced border)
Subcut into 22 - 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles

FABRIC #3 (darkest):

- ✘ Cut 18 - 2 1/2" x WOF strips (blocks)
- ✘ Cut 2 - 6 1/2" x WOF strips (pieced border)
Subcut into 22 - 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles
- ✘ Cut 1 - 3 1/2" x WOF strip (border cornerstones)
Subcut into 4 - 3 1/2" squares
- ✘ Cut 1 - 2" x WOF (border cornerstones)
Subcut into 4 - 2" squares

FABRIC #4 (print):

- ✘ Cut 3 - 2 1/2" x WOF strips (applique border)
Subcut into 2 - 2 1/2" x 20 1/2" &
2 - 2 1/2" x 24 1/2"
- ✘ Cut 8 - 4 1/2" x WOF strips (outer border)

APPLIQUE:


- ✘ Enlarge and cut one each of template pieces. You may want to reverse (mirror image) each piece for fused applique.
Remember to add a seam allowance if you are doing the needle turn method

PIECING BLOCKS

1. Join a 2 1/2" x WOF strip from fabrics #1, #2 and #3 as shown. Press toward the darkest fabrics. Make 18 strip sets.




2. Cut into 104 - 6 1/2" x 6 1/2" squares.




PIECED BORDER

Gather:


- 88 - 3 1/2" squares Fabric #1
- 22 - 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric #2
- 22 - 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric #3
- 4 - 3 1/2" squares Fabric #3
- 8 - 2" x 3 1/2" rec. Fabric #1




1. Draw a diagonal line on the back side of the 88 - 3 1/2" squares of Fabric #1.



2. Place a 3 1/2" square, right sides together, on the right side of the Fabric #3 rectangle and one on the left side of the Fabric #2 rectangle. Sew on the line.



TIP: The original rectangle (3 1/2" x 6 1/2") size must be maintained after the triangles are added to the corners. Therefore, when the squares are folded back, the corners must meet (steps 3 & 4). By sewing just to the side (toward the outer corner) of the line, your corners should meet and the original size maintained.




APPLIQUE


3. Press the squares as shown to create triangle corners. Make sure the corners meet exactly with the original rectangle corner.



4. Once you are sure your corners meet, fold the square back open and cut away the back two layers, leaving a quarter inch seam allowance.



5. Now repeat the previous steps on the diagonal opposite corner of each rectangle. See diagram.



Gather:

- 21 1/2" square Fabric #1
- 2 - 2 1/2" x 20 1/2" Fabric #4
- 2 - 2 1/2" x 24 1/2" Fabric #4
- Applique pieces prepared for applique

1. Using your favorite method, applique the ribbon to the 21 1/2" square of Fabric #1. Follow the placement diagram. Be sure it is centered. Trim the square to 20 1/2" square, keeping the applique centered.

2. Attach the 2 1/2" x 20 1/2" strips to the top and bottom. Press away from the center.


3. Attach the 2 1/2" x 24 1/2" strips to the sides. Press away from the center.



FINAL ASSEMBLY

Gather:


- 104 - 6 1/2" blocks
- 1 - 24 1/2" applique block
- 4 - pieced borders
- 16 - 2" x WOF strips of Fabric #1
- 8 - 4 1/2" x WOF strips of Fabric #4
- 4 - 2" squares of Fabric #3



6. Piece two top/bottom borders and two side borders exactly as shown. Placement of the units is important, so be sure to check against the diagrams.

7. On the top/bottom borders add a 2" x 3 1/2" Fabric #1 rectangle and a 3 1/2" square of Fabric #3 to each end as shown.

8. On the end of each side border, add a 2" x 3 1/2" rectangle of Fabric #1.

1. Below is the assembly diagram. Assemble the center with the 104 $6\frac{1}{2}$ " blocks and the applique block. Follow the pressing arrows.

2. Using the 2" Fabric #1 strips and the 2" Fabric #3 corner squares, measure for and assemble the first border. Join to quilt and press to the outer edge.

3. Sew on the side pieced borders, press toward the center of the quilt. Add the top and bottom pieced border and press toward the center.

4. Measure for and assemble the next border from the remaining 2" Fabric #1 strips. Press toward the outer edge.


5. Measure for and assemble the outer border from the $4\frac{1}{2}$ " strips of Fabric #4. Press toward the outer edge.




- Backing.....7 ½ yards


